AS per the norms of All India Council for Technical Education, University of Mumbai has revised the course pattern to 12 + 4 years, from the academic year 1998 - 99 to maintain course uniformity across the country; these modifications were made considering the required academic experience (knowledge or proficiency) of a candidate.

The First year of the Degree Course B. F. A. (Applied Art) is designed to assist students in developing the proficiency and motivation. Strong emphasis is given to "Learning by Doing". Students are expected to develop their abilities and extend their experience by addressing problems and broadening the range of their working methods. The fundamentals of Applied Art are introduced to the students during the first year.

Specialization program starts from the Second year onwards, where the students are also introduced to the elective subjects:

- * Lettering & Typography,
- ※ Illustration,
- **※** Photography,
- ※ Computer Graphics,
- * Exhibition Design, Display and Stage Craft.

Third year students have to select any one elective of their choice, which they have to study till the Final Year along with the Communication Design as a major subject.

The Final year comprises of a complete project in communication design and elective subject. To give thorough understanding of subject matter and theories involved in the practices, Project reports or Dissertations are written by the students.

Maharashtra State Candidate and OMS candidate are eligible to appear for the MH-AAC-CET conducted by the competent authority of Govt. of Maharashtra for the academic year.

Even though Outside Maharashtra State (OMS) candidates are eligible to appear for the MHAAC-CET, it is specially made clear that such **OMS candidate will not be able to participate in the Centralized Admission Process (CAP) on the basis of score in MH - AAC- CET.** This OMS candidate will be able to apply for the admission against the Institutes Level Seats only.

The Facility of Constitutional Reservation is not available for the OMS candidates. Therefore all OMS candidates will be treated as OPEN / GENERAL category candidates in the entire admission process.
